

## 2007 Child of the Year Contest

Guidelines for selection of the 2007 Child of the Year are listed below. The entry form is included in this issue of the ArSHA newsletter and can be reproduced. Please consider the children you know and submit a nomination for this award. Your input is very important to ArSHA's efforts to promote public awareness.

### Guidelines:

1. Child must be between 3 and 18 years of age.
2. Child must have a speech, language and/or hearing impairment and have received treatment for such impairment.
3. Child must be agreeable to public appearances and to having his/her photo taken.
4. Parent or guardian must agree to accompany the child to public appearances.
5. Child must be sponsored by parents, friends, teachers, speech/hearing professionals or organizations.
6. All entries become the property of the Child of the Year Committee and all decisions of the Committee are final.
7. All applications must be postmarked no later than April 3rd, 2006.
8. ArSHA cannot guarantee that any specific prizes will be awarded to the Child of the Year or his/her family.
