Leonard L. (Chick) LaPointe, Ph.D. currently occupies an endowed distinguished professor chair, the Francis Eppes Professor of Communication Science & Disorder at Florida State University in Tallahassee. He chaired the Department of Speech and Hearing Science at Arizona State University for 9 years. His research focus is in the area of neurological disorders of communication and cognition. He is the founding and current Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of Medical Speech-Language Pathology*. Dr. LaPointe has authored or co-authored 8 books, 40 book chapters, over 90 journal articles, and presented more than 400 papers, lectures, or invited workshops in the United States and around the world. He enjoys salt water, music, wine and the culinary arts, reading, writing, humor, and the cultivation of optimism and the absurd.

Neurolinguistic-Neurocognitive Clinical Research


This presentation will focus on recent research from the Neurolinguistic-Neurocognitive Research Laboratory at FSU. The overarching theme of our laboratory is the effect of interference, competition, and distraction on cognitive and linguistic processing, especially in persons with brain damage. The practical and clinical implications of this research will be illustrated by examining effects of dual task and distraction tasks on public health issues related to distracted driving, injurious falls in the elderly, and cognitive load gait and ambulation relationships to injurious falls in brain-based movement disorders such as Parkinson disease. Additionally, our collaborative research on how destabilized birdsong can inform us about language recovery in aphasia will be explored.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of this workshop you will be able to:

- Describe the theoretic relationships of distraction, interference, and competition on cognitive and linguistic processing
- Identify aspects of public health and safety that are impacted by multi-tasking and distraction
- Specify the nature of fall risk in Parkinson disease by simultaneous talking while walking
- Discuss how destabilized birdsong might contribute to understanding and exploring recovery of language in aphasia
